Meet diverse learning needs by providing audio versions of titles, vocabulary support, and multi-leveled lessons.



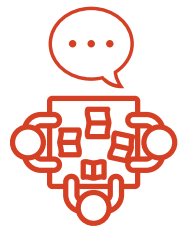
