- How does the man with the groceries react when Boomer tries to help him cross the road safely?
- When Boomer passes by a baseball field, he hears a "CRACK!" What does this sound stand for and what does Boomer do once he hears the sound?

- What does Boomer mean when he wishes for a "forever home"?
- How does the kitten that Boomer helps in the park lead Boomer to his forever home?

- Boomer turns out to be a perfect therapy dog when he visits the patients at Children's Hospital because Boomer can make the kids laugh. What other qualities does Boomer show in the story that would make him a great therapy dog?
- How is a service dog different from a therapy dog?
