- 6. In the story, "Rich Man Seeks a Daughter-in-law", what does the girl tell the son that she would do to feed her family for the longest time?
- 7. Why did the father want his son to marry someone who understood this simple principle?
- 8. What does the girl say to transform the great smelly, slobbery, small-tooth dog and why were her words so powerful?
- 9. Can you think of a time when someone you thought you were **not** going to like, turned out to be someone you liked a lot and they became a good friend?
- 10. How are "The Singing Turtle" and "Makki and Kakki" similar?
- 11. In what ways are the stories "The Stinky Sprits" and "The Wishing Foxes" similar?
- 12. Why did the Monkey King sacrifice himself to save his subjects?
- 13. What is the lesson from the story "Five Threads"?
