### **Book Ideas**




#### **Condor Comeback**

by Sy Montgomery and Tianne Strombeck

Themes: Nonfiction | Science | Animals

- Introduce the author by watching her Meet-the-Author Movie.
- Show the <u>ebook preview</u> and ask students to read the first 8 pages. Use the <u>Nonfiction Read</u> and Respond to record details while reading.
- Open the <u>Scientists in the Field</u> series page to find new titles to read.
- Invite readers to choose a title from the series to learn more about and report back to the class.



### **Bud, Not Buddy**

by Christopher Paul Curtis

Themes: Historical Fiction | African American | Runaways

- Introduce the author by playing his <u>Audio Name Pronunciation</u> and watching his <u>Meet-the-Author Movie.</u>
- Listen as Curtis reveals the inspiration for Bud, Not Buddy in his Meet-the-Author Recording.
- Invite students to compare and contrast their lives with Bud's by completing a <u>Cultural</u> Representation Reflection.
- Access this <u>guide</u> filled with activities including matching games, puzzles, and additional passages to extend learning.

## **Author Study Ideas**



#### Avi

- Listen to Avi's Audio Name Pronunciation. What do you learn about his nickname?
- Learn about the author's life and work by viewing his <u>Meet-the-Author Movies</u>, <u>recordings</u>, and <u>video and audio interviews</u>.
- Show how to browse all books by the author, then filter by grade level and resource type.
- Use the share tool to create a shelf card for the <u>author</u>, adding to book baskets, displays, or shelves.
